The workshop will equip participants an understanding of the process of developing monitoring and evaluation (M&E) frameworks. Frameworks that integrate M&E in a planned fashion are an increasingly prevalent requirement of program design.

The workshop will present a conceptual model for the development of M&E frameworks, discuss design and implementation issues, consider barriers or impediments, and identify strategies for addressing these. Participants will learn about the format of an M&E framework, the parameters of the tasks, and the approach, techniques and skills involved in design and implementation.

The workshop will follow the 'Guide to developing Monitoring and Evaluation Frameworks' developed by the trainer. Each section in the Guide will be considered followed by discussion and small group exercises on the application of the framework. This Guide will be made available to participants and can be applied in their workplaces or evaluation practices.

Anne Markiewicz presented this popular workshop as part of the AES Professional Learning Program in 2010 and to previous AES conferences. In addition, she has presented the workshop to a variety of agencies within Australia, PNG and in the UK.
